Northumberland Land Trust Hosts Environmental Speaker Series: Exciting Presentation on the Seven Natural Wonders of the Trent River Valley

Cobourg, ON – The third and last in this winter’s series of free presentations hosted by the Northumberland Land Trust will be held on Tuesday, February 11, 2014 at 7:00 p.m. As in previous years, the Northumberland Land Trust Speaker Series takes place at 600 William Street in Cobourg, Ontario.

This exceptional presentation will feature Ewa Bednarczuk, Ecologist and Stewardship Specialist for Lower Trent Conservation. She will speak on the "Seven Natural Wonders of the Trent River Valley ". The talk will highlight some of the lesser known yet unique natural features within the Lower Trent watershed region from the virgin forest of Peter's Woods to the scenic Ranney Falls gorge to the hydrological jewel at Douglas Springs.

The doors open at 7:00 p.m. for light refreshments. Ewa Bednarczuk will begin at 7:30 p.m. Admission is free.

- engaging private landowners and volunteers in positive conservation actions
- increasing local knowledge and awareness about natural heritage conservation

Land trusts are not for profit, charitable organizations which have as one of their core activities the acquisition of land or interests in land (such as conservation easements) for the purpose of conservation. Most land trusts focus on conserving the biological values of land but across the continent, land trusts have also been established to protect scenic, historical, agricultural and recreation lands.
